Introduce the main character 2. Give a short summary of the contents and the plot. 3. Ask the "unanswered question", eg "Will Mary find out who the mysterious visitor is?" but don't give away the end of the story! 4. Be persuasive and encourage interest. <p>(Please don't copy what's written on the book!)</p>	<div data-bbox="1774 354 2024 395" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 2px;"> <p>About the Author:</p> </div> <p>Find out something interesting about the author of the book you read. (Please don't copy what's written on the book!)</p> <div data-bbox="1774 746 2024 820" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 2px;"> <p>From the Newspapers:</p> </div> <p>Think of imaginary names of 2 or 3 newspapers and write a sentence about the book. (For example: "Nobody writes better about the future than J.L. Booker" (Beverly Times)</p>
